It's also exciting to hear that our 3rd graders did well on the first chance of the Third Grade Reading Guarantee Test. We were able to have 42.8% pass it in October. The iReady Diagnostic window closed for the winter assessment yesterday, so we hope the results of this school-wide computer test is as successful or better when we return January 4th for the staff and January 5th for the students.
